BYLAWS

August 28, 1990

CHAPTER I MEETINGS:

Section I: Meetings shall be held the fourth Tuesday of each month. If the regular meeting falls on a holiday, a notice will be sent to each member specifying the new date.

Section II: The following shall be the order of business:

- (a) Roll call
- (b) Recognition of visitors
- (c) Minutes of previous meeting
- (d) Report of the Treasurer
- (e) Report of Committees
- (f) Unfinished business
- (g) New business
- (h) Miscellaneous business
- (i) Election of Officers
- 0) Adjournment

CHAPTER II ELECTIONS:

Section I: Elections of Officers shall be held at the annual meeting in November. A Nominating Committee, consisting of not less than five (5) members, shall be appointed by the Commodore in September. The Committee will announce the nominees in October, hold elections in November, and newly elected officers will take office in January.

Section II: Nominations from the floor will be accepted in October, and five minutes before election.

Section III: All nominees shall be present at meeting when nominated, and elected, or a valid letter of intent shall be in the hands of the Nominating Committee prior to election.

CHAPTER III NOTICES:

Section I: Notice shall be sent to each member in good standing of all meetings, and the purpose for which they are called.

Section II: Every member shall furnish the Corresponding Secretary with an address to which all notices shall be sent.

CHAPTER IV PENNANT:

Section I: Only Club members shall have the right to fly the club pennant.

Section II: No member shall fly a club pennant or participate in any club function unless the owner of the boat maintains adequate liability insurance.

CHAPTER V CHANGES:

Section I: These By-Laws, or any part of them, may be suspended at any meeting with a quorum present by consent of two-thirds of the members present, and may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the members present at any meeting, with a quorum present provided notice of the proposed amendment or repeal shall have been given in writing ten (10) days prior to the meeting. Any amendments or repeal in the Constitution or By-Laws shall be furnished to any member upon request.

Section II: The general membership shall have the right to propose changes to the By-Laws by written request to the Recording Secretary from twenty (20) members in good standing. These changes may be adopted in accordance with the previous section.
